Freedom Preparatory Academy Vineyard Campus will measure reading growth using the state Acadience Reading Assessment. This assessment will be given to all K-5th graders BOY, MOY, EOY to measure growth.

## Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

1. Freedom Preparatory Academy will adopt and continue using the Wonders researched based language arts program in grades K-5 for the 2022-2023 school year. We will purchase consumable workbooks, leveled readers library, and big books set for each grade level and class. We will also use money to bring in Wonders trainers for continuous teacher professional development throughout the school year. Our current language arts scores are low in both Acadience and RISE. With stronger teacher training and richer student materials will allow our students to make more significant progress. (\$35,000)
2. Freedom Preparatory Academy will continue to employ academic reading intervention paraprofessionals and a literacy coach to work with struggling readers in small groups or one on one throughout the school day. (Salary \$10,000)
3. Freedom Preparatory Academy will purchase books for Battle of the Books and AR reading competitions. These programs are great motivation in getting students to read independently. By providing the books in our school library and to give away free of charge it gives students access to all the books to fully participate. We will also use a portion of the money for reading program incentives. (\$5,000)
4. Freedom Preparatory Academy will implement Story Studio which allows students to write and publish their own stories supporting the reading and writing connection. This will include the fees for a part-time story studio coach. (Salary \$1,500 Supplies \$1000)
5. Freedom Preparatory Academy will purchase Heggarty curriculum for grade 2. These daily phonemic awareness lessons will supplement ELA Wonders curriculum. These lessons and materials will also be used in small intervention groups. Manipulative phonic kits will be used with students to increase reading skills as designed by the state LETRS (the science of reading program). (\$3,000)
6. Continue to purchase library books at all reading levels to ensure all students have access to updated quality literature. (\$3000) Library shelving to put purchased books on. (\$5,850.00)
